### Looking Ahead...

Our next big event will be our annual Events Week which this year is taking place from 9th-13th February 2015. This is a concentrated week of events where we focus all of our efforts on sharing the Gospel message with students and staff at Imperial. We're planning to hold an apologetics lunch bar every day bar one during the week, as well as three evening events—a live lounge which will be a Gospel-centred acoustic night with live music and food, a film event where we'll show clips of a popular film accompanied by a Gospel talk and a Grill-a-Christian, panel-style event where people can ask questions openly.

We'll also be holding a follow-up course for people who have attended events week and are interested in learning more about Christianity, with a view to examining the evidence so that they can decide whether or not to put their faith in Jesus. We'll be using the 'Uncover John' resources which are produced by UCCF (Universities and Colleges Christian Fellowship) as the material for the follow up course. Uncover John places emphasis on examining the evidence for the life and claims of Jesus and coming to an informed conclusion. We're hopeful that this will be successful and we're looking forward to what the Lord will do with events week in 2015.
